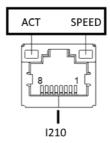

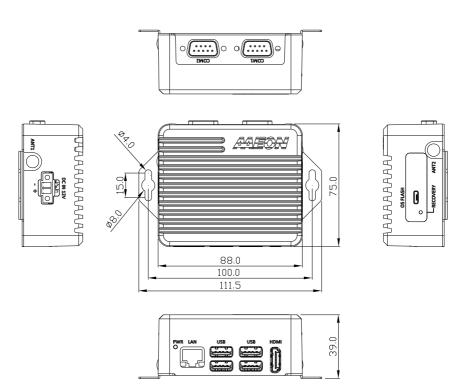

LAN Indicator Behavior

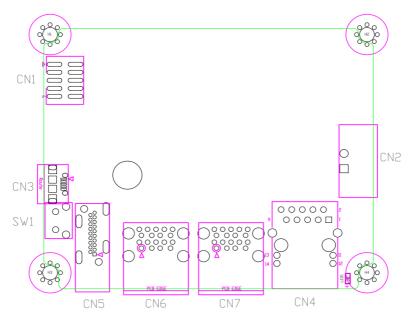

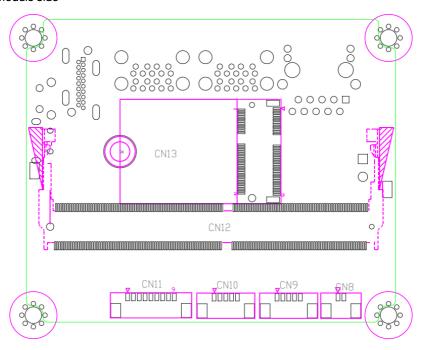

2.3 List of Jumpers

The board has a number of jumpers that allow you to configure your system to suit your application.

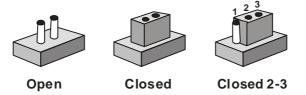
The table below shows the function of each of the board's jumpers

Label	Function
CN1 (Pin 7-8)	AT/ATX mode select

2.3.1 Setting Jumpers

You can configure your system to match the needs of your application by setting jumpers. A jumper is the simplest kind of electric switch. It consists of two metal pins and a small metal clip (often protected by a plastic cover) that slides over the pins to connect them. To "close" a jumper you connect the pins with the clip.

To "open" a jumper you remove the clip. Sometimes a jumper will have three pins, labeled 1, 2 and 3. In this case you would connect either pins 1 and 2 or 2 and 3.



A pair of needle-nose pliers may be helpful when working with jumpers.

If you have any questions about the best hardware configuration for your application, contact your local distributor or sales representative before you make any changes.

Generally, you simply need a standard cable to make most connections.

The AT/ATX Mode Select functions by connecting pins 7 and 8 of CN1. To prevent damage to the system, do not connect pins 7 and 8 to any other pin.

Chapter 3

OS Flash guide

3.1 Force USB Recovery Mode

Follow these steps to place the system in Force USB Recovery Mode.

- Power down the device. If connected, remove the AC adapter from the device.
 The device MUST be powered OFF, not in suspend or sleep mode.
- 2. Connect the Micro-USB plug on the USB cable to the Recovery Port on the BOXER-8221Al and the other end to an available USB port on the host PC.

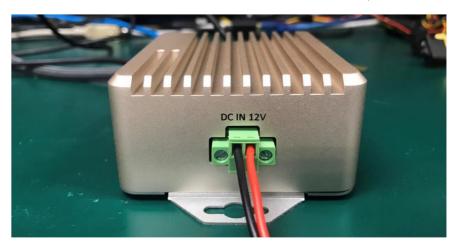


3. Press and hold the FORCE RECOVERY button. FORCE RECOVERY button is highlighted in the following image:



While holding the FORCE RECOVERY button, connect the power adapter.

Continue to hold the FORCE RECOVERY button for two seconds, then release.



 When device is in recovery mode, Isusb command on host PC will list a line of "NVidia Corp"

3.2 Software & BSP

Please follow the steps below to install the image.

- 1) Open terminal on Linux host PC.
- 2) Download the ACLinux_4.9_ACLNX49D.NV03.BOXER-8221Al.2.tar.gz image.

 Note: The file name may be changed without notice.
- 3) Decompress/ Extract ACLinux_4.9_ACLNX49D.NV03.BOXER-8221Al.2.tar.gz

\$ tar -zxvf ACLinux 4.9 ACLNX49D.NV03.BOXER-8221AI.2.tar.gz

4) Access the bootloader folder

\$ cd bootloader

- 5) Start up the BOXER-8221Al in Force USB Recovery Mode. See previous section (Chapter 3.1) for directions.
- Execute the following command to install the image.For Jetson Nano module A:

\$ sudo ./flashall.sh

For Jetson Nano module B (includes eMMC):

\$ sudo ./flashall b.sh

7) The ACLinux account is "aaeon" and the password is "aaeon".
